Dave Stack received a BS degree in Forestry from Southern Illinois University in 1964 and Master of Forestry degree from Duke University in 1965. He served in the U.S. Navy three years, 1965 – 1968, as an officer aboard the aircraft carrier USS America and as a Navy instructor at an air training center in Georgia.

He has been a professional forester since 1965. He worked for the U.S. Forest Service in California, Oregon, Wisconsin, Minnesota, West Virginia and Montana. He was a District Ranger on the Monongahela National Forest in West Virginia for seven years. From 1985 through 1999 he was the Missoula District Ranger on the Lolo National Forest in Missoula, Montana.

Stack retired in September 1999 with over 32 years of service. Since 2002 has served on the Board of Directors of the National Museum of Forest Service History where he currently serves as Vice President.
