Gray Reynolds served in the US Forest Service for 35 years in a wide variety of leadership and staff positions both in the field and in Washington, DC. He received a BS in Forest Management from Utah State University and an MS in National Resources Administration from Michigan State University.

He began his career as a Forester in Teton National Forest and retired from the Forest Service in 1997 after serving as the Deputy Chief, National Forest Systems. After leaving the Forest Service he became the General Manager of Snowbasin Ski Resort in Utah, the site of the Men's and Women's 2002 Olympic Speed events. He oversaw the construction program to create venues for the Winter Olympics.

Since 2003 he has held the position of president of the National Museum of Forest Service History. He also sits on the board of The Sawtooth Society.
